I am sure we all send enormous thanks to Nick for what he has contributed to the Village Hall and to the Village over his 10 years in the Chair together with our best wishes to him and his family for their recovery. We look forward to seeing him again soon at our Village Events and around the Village.

Claire Barnes – as many of you will know Claire has moved rather suddenly from the Village and is now as we speak probably well into a new role as a Magistrate in the Bournemouth Area. She has contributed significantly to the Village Hall and the Village more widely in working with Tim Arnold to raise the quality of our Communications, specifically the Website, Monthly Newsletters and Publicising Village Events and last year oversaw the organisation of the Village Fete, and she was responsible for replacing our Notice Board before the old one totally collapsed. She will be greatly missed but we hope to see her from time to time and in the meantime send her our very best wishes. Claire was successful in replacing herself in the Communications role. <u>David Ainscough</u> – who began his village involvement with helping set up for the Queens Jubilee and has also been heavily involved in organising the Fete - set up, pack down & signs as well as getting involved in other vital matters such as fitting a new padlock to the shed and organising the drinks for events like this.

Unfortunately, Angela has had to step down due to the organising of hers and Mike's house rebuild. She will still be there running the Cake Stall at this year's Fete and in other events I am sure. 2023 Events

- Early May Coronation of King Charles Another fabulous get together with the large Scout Marquee out again but only needed for shade on a glorious day with our very own Queen Angela leading festivities from her head table on the Plinth. It was a very much enjoyed early summer Village Get Together – our version of a Street Party
- End May Village Fete Most successful ever for our Charities MYTIME, St Nicholas Roof & Village Hall Refurbishments. The Après Fete and Presentations Evenings were also much enjoyed by many of those involved making the Fete such a success.
- Purbeck Artists and Stallholders (PASH) have continued over some 15 years to be our largest hire but also a major contributor to the village. They once again put on two significant events for Worth Matravers Village, bringing interest and activity for 5 weeks throughout the Summer and a week at the start of December. The latter offering us some unique alternatives for Christmas presents.
- August BBQ Picnic a new approach this year, which due to an inclement weather forecast, ended up being BBQ in the Village Hall and turned into BBQ in the Village Hall Garden as the weather was much nicer than expected. This was a bring your own ingredients and hand them over to master BBQ Chefs to cook them for you. A lot of fun was had by all who attended.
- November Bring and Share supper in the Village Hall. Another village get together enjoyed by jolly, participative crowd.
- Carols on the Green which, due to yet another poor weather forecast, and
 particularly in the interests of the musicians also ended up in the Hall. It is
 possible that in future years the Carols, which is always so well attended could
 be Carols in the Hall, or maybe once St Nicholas has got his hat back on,
 Carols in the Church as was so successful the year before last.

• 2024 Events will see the return of the regular events - the Fete, for which preparations are already well underway. If you haven't got involved yet, it's not too late; a BBQ on the Green, Carols as already mentioned but also some other village get togethers are possibilities the first of which is a Sustainable Worth sponsored event 'Meet Oly Rush' on Thursday, the 25th April, and an Italian Evening on Sat, 11th May. And, by the way, all are welcome to set up Village Events and the Events Team will do what they can to support you.

Worth Film Club – this continues to be a very popular, well attended monthly event, from September through to June. A chance to watch some quite unique films chosen for us by Claude Bonfanti and Peter Handy. It has become part of the village fabric.

Other clubs and user organisations – Throughout the year we have also supported events and meetings for other local organisations and our Newsletters provide a way of keeping the village informed about what's happening. These include:

Fund Raising – as we implement our planned improvements to this very special Village Facility the Trustees have shifted focus to fund raising events and other fund raising possibilities. Our carefully accumulated reserves, fortuitously supplemented by two Covid grants have been significantly reduced by expenditure on refurbishments over the last couple of years and this year's planned expenditure will leave our reserves c. £22,000 lower than at the end of 2023.
